

WHO WE ARE...

Furaha Africa Relief Association (FARA) was incorporated in Alberta in 2020 with its own bylaws and became registered as a charity in 2021. (see the Objects of FARA on back of brochure)

In summary this new organization has a membership of 8 with the objective of increasing it to around 8-10 members who will meet several times a year to get updates from the board and at an annual meeting appoint directors, approve budgets and deal with any other business of the organization.

Currently there are 4 members that make up the Board of Directors. All meetings are held via Zoom.

HOW DO I BECOME A MEMBER?

FARA invites people who have an interest in missions in Africa to consider membership with FARA.

Qualifications for becoming a member as per our bylaws include:

- Each Member shall be an individual who is at least 18 years of age,
- Has not been found by a court in Canada or elsewhere to be mentally incompetent, does not have the status of being bankrupt,
- Is in full agreement with the purposes of the Association, and is a Christ follower.
- 40% of the members must be an active member of a congregation associated with the Church of God (Anderson Indiana).
- For a person to become a member of the association requires a favourable vote be passed by a majority of the members at a regular meeting of the society.

There are several other opportunities for ministry:

- 1. Board of Directors Members of FARA can be considered to become a director of FARA if they would like to have more involvement in the managing of the affairs of the charity. Currently there are four members: Del Pierce- Treasurer; Wendy Inscho-Secretary; Ken Wiebe-President & Kathy Smith
- 2. Child Sponsorship Administrator Appointed by the Board of Directors. Currently this position is filled by Julie Wiebe & Kathy Smith.

Sponsor Correspondence Coordinator – Appointed by and working under the Sponsorship Administrator to manage the correspondence between the FARA office in Uganda and the donors.

A - To relieve poverty and advance education in developing nations by establishing a sponsorship program for children in need to provide food, clothing, and financial assistance for their education and health care.

B - To relieve poverty for families in need in developing nations by providing items such as farm animals, farming tools and sewing machines.

D - To advance the Christian faith by preaching and providing training sessions and seminars and to relieve poverty by providing financial assistance for transportation to attend these sessions and seminars to those in need and providing Bibles to individuals and families in need.
