FURAHA REPORT FOR 2021 FROM THE UGANDA SPONSORSHIP OFFICE...

This is a condensed report for the year 2021. This last year was even harder than the previous year, as everyone thought we would be coming out of the COVID-19 lockdown. We had a month of some normalcy in January, and then we resumed our closures. Again, the Government of Uganda put in measures for lockdown which included all international and national travel restrictions, all schools were closed, churches too and the roadblocks and curfews were once again enforced.

This long closure of schools affected our sponsor children in their education negatively. Our sponsorship office and the educational secretariat again met to make some decisions. We again decided to use the sponsorship money in 3 ways:

- 1. Education making school packages that the children could work on at home
- 2. Food packages which were distributed to them and their families
- 3. Monitoring through visitation by our educators, social workers and sponsorship workers.

Through the visitation, we found that many families had moved away from their homes to new homes, and even some moved away to other countries. It was such a hard, trying time – and even though most adults were allowed to work in some capacities, public transportation was closed down. I was thankful that our staff, along with Tim and I were allowed to move and visit places to encourage and check on the situation. This was a hard year! But, once again we thank God for good partners.

FARA was consistent in their giving to help the needy – from sponsorship funds, to community projects, and Covid relief. We are truly thankful for the attention and kindness to help those who are less fortunate. God bless you!

We will highlight a few challenges and then a few victories.

CHALLENGES:

1) Keeping up with the needs, and realizing how deep the hurt, frustration and poverty is for those who need our help. We were sad to see many of our TAPP clients and even sponsorship families displaced or challenged to pay rent with no funds coming in. This is where relief really assisted with some of the hunger issues. Jjajjas too were finding it so hard to keep their grandchildren busy, protected from bad elements, and working on their school work.

2) Keeping track of our schools – both rural and urban, and making sure there were some on our school lands to keep them from being disturbed or theft occurring. our students with their school packages. Many left their schools to return to their villages as they had no sala-

ry or place to garden. We also needed them to assist with making sure the kids were work-

ing on their home packages and doing okay emotionally and physically.

3) Figuring out ways for our staff to stay on top of their work load, when there were so many restrictions in place by the government, and making sure they too were emotionally, physically, financially, and spiritually healthy. Fear of getting COVID was still an issue, but then, the government started immunizing the elderly, those in community service and government workers.

4) There was a frustration that the length of the lockdown just kept going. We saw other countries around us opening up in all ways, and Uganda kept so many restrictions in place. Even with visitors, we had many groups planned and so many cancelled due to the restrictions in place.

5) We lost one of our children in Congo to an accident – Ushindi Bauma Samuel. He was only 20 years old.

VICTORIES / HIGHLIGHTS:

1) The sponsors still sent money for their sponsored kids during this time. This was a blessing and a miracle. We even received new sponsored kids – as well in Congo! We thank them so very much!

2) Some kids miraculously finished their schooling – either online or through hands-on training and for that we rejoice. Here are three of those (L-R):
